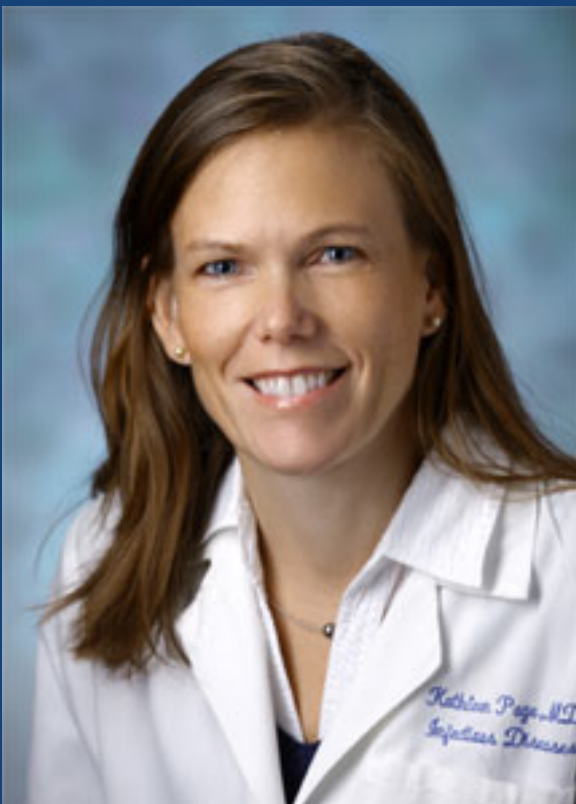

Dr. Page's work focuses on improving access and quality of care to the emerging Latino community in Baltimore. Her practice in the Moore Clinic and at the Baltimore City Health Department primarily serves Latin American immigrants with HIV. As Baltimore City Health Department's Director of STD/HIV/TB Clinical Services, she has established the Latino HIV Outreach Program to improve timely HIV diagnosis and access to care for Latinos. She is also the co-founder and co-director of the Bayview Centro SOL (Center for Salud/Health and Opportunities for Latinos) to meet the health needs of Latino migrants through education, community advocacy, clinical care, and research.
